Regulations

1. THE SHOW will commence at 8:30 am on Saturday, 18th October 2025
 2. Members tickets \$20.00 enables admission to one guest and admission for all children under 16 years and free entry for all exhibits except Horse Section.
 3. Admission to ground for non-members - Adults \$10.00 and children 5 to 16 years - \$2.00
 4. All exhibits except Horses must be *bona fide* property of exhibitors at the time of entry. The Committee reserves the right to disqualify any exhibit or entry regarding any false statement which has been made. If called upon by the committee of Stewards exhibitors must make Statutory Declarations that their exhibits conform to the conditions under which the prizes for which they compete are offered. All exhibitors must place their exhibits in the space allotted to them by the Steward. All pavilion exhibits unless otherwise stated must be in on Friday 17th October no later than 9:30am ready for judging to commence. If required any exhibit of livestock (horses and cattle) must later take part in the Grand Parade. Failure to do so shall make the exhibitor liable to forfeiture of any prize awarded.
 5. The judges are empowered to withhold prizes in any class where exhibit is unworthy.
 6. The Committee will give every possible facility to exhibitors and every care will be taken of exhibits but no responsibility will be incurred by the society.
 7. Exhibits shall not be removed before 4:30pm under penalty of disqualification and a fine of \$5.00.
 8. Any sale of stock shall be subject to a charge of 1.5% of the value realised.
 9. The decision of the judges will be final. Any protest must be in writing and accompanied by a \$10.00 deposit which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous. The protest must be lodged with the Secretary before 2:30pm on the show day, to be dealt with by the Committee.
 10. No exhibitor to be allowed in section or yard where their exhibit is being judged except where necessary to lead, ride or drive exhibit. No exhibitor shall interfere with or insult the judge. The stewards
having the right to remove the offender and order forfeiture of any awards.
 11. No exhibitor to wear or display any ribbons or cards which have been won in other sections whilst judging is in progress.
 12. Exhibitor must display any ribbons or cards won during the show for the hours of exhibition but must not display any awards not won at this show.
 13. Application for space for non competitive exhibits must be made to the Secretary 7 days prior to the show.
 14. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased, dangerous or objectionable, the Society reserves the right to order its removal or refuse its admission to the show.
 15. Any regulations not herein provided will be dealt with according to the regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society of Sydney.
 16. Prize money to be picked up on day of show. Money not collected will be forfeited.
 17. Sponsorship and donations will be acknowledged in the schedule of prizes.
 18. All entry fees for non-members - 50 cents per entry unless otherwise stated.
 19. All electrical leads and appliances used on the grounds need to be checked and appropriately tagged by a licensed electrician.
 20. Prize money may be reduced if insufficient entries are received.
 21. All advertisements and editorials appearing in this show schedule are not to be copied in any way.
 22. Competitors taking part in any show competition do so at their own risk.
 23. Unless in POSSESSION of a member or guest ticket all patrons must PAY before entry to the show grounds.
 24. Show closes at 6:00pm.
 25. Waiver forms to be signed by all exhibitors.
 26. No alcohol to be brought to the Show - bar facilities available.
 27. Regardless of breed regulations, all colts and stallions must be shown with a bridle and a bit.

Recipe for STATE RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

Sponsored by the Australian Dried Fruits Association. The Following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

Here's what you need.

250g Sultanas, 250g Chopped Raisins, 250g Currants, 125g Chopped Mixed Peel, 90g Chopped Red Glazed Cherries, 90g Chopped Blanched Almonds, 1/3 Cup Sherry or Brandy, 250g Plain Flour, 60g Self-Raising Flour, 1/4 Teaspoon Grated Nutmeg, 1/2 Teaspoon Ground Ginger, 1/2 Teaspoon Ground Cloves, 250g Butter, 250g Soft Brown Sugar, 1/2 Teaspoon Lemon Essence OR finely grated Lemon Rind, 1/2 Teaspoon Almond Essence, 1/2 Teaspoon Vanilla Essence, 4 Large Eggs.

Here's what to do.

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flour and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square tin, no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

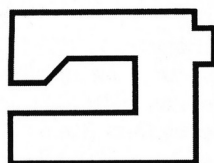

 - b) **Article:** a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home e.g. blanket with an outfit e.g. bag; for amusement e.g. toy; as a decoration e.g. picture etc.
2. The **whole** article and/or garment must be constructed of and contain a minimum of **80% sheep wool**.
3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted).
4. **A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit.** If a label is not available as a handspun/felted, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
6. All three articles/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete at the State Final.
8. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitors permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
11. It is the responsibility of the Group Society and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the state judging.

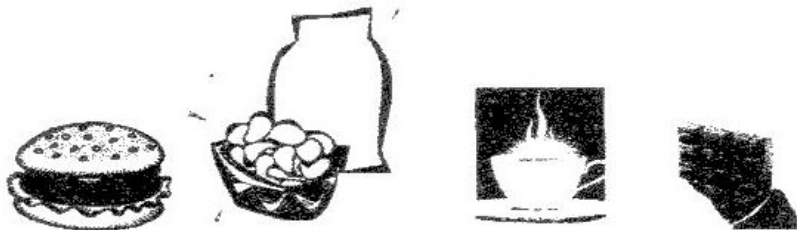
